How do we measure success in ministry? This morning I was reading from Jeremiah. God called this young man to the extremely important and difficult task of preaching the truth to people who did not want to hear it. Jeremiah's initial response to God was that he was not equipped for the work God was calling him to do. God reassured him that He would sustain him and speak through him. Ultimately, Jeremiah responded in obedience. And he lived happily ever after... Not quite.

Jeremiah faced rejection, ridicule, and a people who abused him for speaking the truth. He was told that his message was not from God. He spent his entire ministry calling people to repentance, while they continued in their sin thinking they were ok with God. Do you ever feel this way?

If we measure success in ministry by how well people respond to the message, Jeremiah would be considered a complete failure. His example would not be held up as one to follow, but we are reminded that God chose him for that purpose. No one promised any of us that ministry would be easy. In fact, most of us were probably told early in life to expect rejection and failure at some point. Jeremiah serves as a reminder that it could be worse. He also serves as a reminder that success is based on our obedience and faithfulness to God. Most of us will never suffer the trials of Jeremiah.

Fortunately, the fruit of our labor is usually evident through life-change in those we minister to. We get to see people saved and discipled in our churches.

We experience genuine worship and joy in our Sunday gatherings.

New families visit our churches and get plugged in to what God is doing there. When these things happen, we rejoice!

But we must remember that even when they don't happen, we are still called to be obedient and faithful to the calling God has placed on each of us.

My prayer for you is that you would be encouraged today to faithfully run the race put before you.

Do not judge your own success by comparing yourself to others. Ask yourself if you are doing everything you can to do what God has called you to do. And rest in the reality that He has a plan and a purpose. He invites us to join Him in this effort for His glory and your benefit.

If I can ever help you, even if it's just a word of encouragement you need, do not hesitate to call on me. We get to do this together.

May the Lord open your eyes today to His goodness and purpose. Better Together!

In August we opened up the new school year with some inspirational, fun, and educational student events. One "off campus" event we promoted and attended was the "Engage Polk" community youth event held at Victory Baptist with youth from various churches coming together to worship and be inspired to take the light of Christ into their schools and share Jesus with their friends.

On August 22nd homeschoolers in the

area participated in a "Literature Fair" at Camp Antioch. Students in grades K-12th

made displays and projects about books they had read over the summer and set them up throughout the camp building to share with each other and their families. Prizes in each age category along with a "kids favorite" category were awarded and everybody enjoyed an evening of fellowship.

For our regular Saturday Day Camp, campers and their families gathered at the camp to become "citizen scientist" for a day as they participated in the University of Georgia's Southeastern Pollinator Census (A.K.A. "Butterfly Count"). Our morning began with a devotional about being "transformed" into a "new creature" when we give our life to Jesus. This was illustrated in how butterflies go through metamorphoses to be transformed from a caterpillar into a butterfly. Students then had a lesson about how to identify insects and spiders, the importance of pollinators in our environment, and how to collect data for the Pollinator Census. Campers and their parents went outside with clipboards and tally sheets to collect official data by observing butterflies and other pollinators for the count which is then submitted to the University of Georgia. After the counting time we celebrated the beautiful late summer day with camp friends and a popsicle party.





PRAY FOR THE MIDDLE EAST


The intense conflict in the Middle East is a reason for Christians to pray. Thousands of people have been killed since Hamas attacked Israel on Oct. 7.
